



Our long time booking lady, Brenda, has been ill and needs time to recover completely. We send you our love Brenda and hope to see you back in the Box Office in the near future.




Summer Production

SPOTLIGHT ON

Anne Kindley



Chelsfield Players started for me 50 years ago. Having moved to Chelsfield Park from Orpington I had always wanted to tread the boards so when I heard about The Chelsfield Players I decided to give it a go.

The family that lived opposite at the time were very much involved in the drama group and suggested I went to the next play reading. I went along to the director's house, in those days the same person directed all the plays (Harold Hart), and read the play "The Hollow" by Agatha Christie. I was offered the small part as the house maid I was thrilled and thoroughly enjoyed my first play. This was in November 1967. Since then I have been involved in over 60 plays either acting or helping backstage.

Some of my most memorable parts have been Emily Bronte in "The Brontes", The woman in "The Woman in White", wearing two tea towels in "Not Now Darling", Virginia in "Outside Edge", Lynne in "Stepping Out" I think in that part I was the first person to swear on the Chelsfield stage and most recently I played the Mother in "The Railway Children".

Over the years my family became involved. My dad was asked to take a small part in the play "Dandy Dick" as they were struggling to find a butler, he then got the bug and performed in many plays and became Chairman for several years. Dear mum always organized the teas and both my children have had parts when children were needed.

I took on the role of Secretary for many years and in 2011 became Chairman.

I have so enjoyed my life with the Players performing in Edinburgh, entertaining so many people, meeting so many friends, and have had a lot of fun and laughter.

In her very modest account of her part in the Chelsfield Players Anne has omitted so much of the work she has done, the time and effort she has put in. Some time back someone had to take home all the cups and saucers used for the refreshments during performances, Anne would load these into her car and return them clean the next day. She has made or overseen many of the costumes and spent a considerable time in the Parish Room loft! There have been many gatherings, play readings, rehearsals and parties held at Anne's house. She has cooked and provided food and drink for many, many people.


For many years Anne and I would set up the chairs for the performances (My preschool age son putting cushions on all the chairs). When it comes to the Village Fare, Anne sees to the stall. She is always ready to give her time to the Players.

Anne mentioned her Father's first involvement with the Players in Dandy Dick she too was in the play and played the part of Sheba, daughter of The Very Rev. Augustin Jedd. This was in March 1974.

For many years the Players performed outside in various gardens, the local paper would send along someone to review the plays. In July 1968 the report on 'The Pleasure Garden' stated "I rather liked Joan Bradfield's performance as a rich lady and Anne Allocca as her maid"

Being part of a group like the Chelsfield Players means being willing to turn your hand to any job that needs you and Anne has certainly done that.
